

Allergen labelling of certain emulsifiers from mustard seed

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Regulation

Regulation (EU) [2024/2512](#) on the provision of food information to consumers, as regards behenic acid from mustard seeds to be used in the manufacturing of certain emulsifiers

What is changing and why?

Products from mustard seeds must be labelled for allergens. However, the EU has decided that foods containing the emulsifiers E 470a, E 471, and E 477, which use behenic acid from mustard seed, do not need to be labelled as allergens as it is extremely unlikely that they would trigger an allergic reaction under the proposed conditions of use.

Actions

Exporters of food products containing the emulsifiers E 470a, E 471, and E 477 (but no other mustard seed products) should remove reference to mustard seed allergies from the labels.

Timeline

The new rules apply from **15 October 2024**.

Food placed on the market or labelled before 1 April 2025 with allergen labelling included for E 470a, E 471, and E 477 can be sold until the stocks are exhausted.
