What is changing and why?

So far in 2025, the following applications for registration as PDOs and PGIs from non-EU countries have been received and are being assessed. (For those already approved, see Approved geographical indications for non-EU products in 2025.)

Applications for registration as PDO

- "Isparta Gülyall", an essential oil obtained from the Isparta rose (Rosa damascena) grown in the province of Isparta in Türkiye (C/2025/1382)
- "■psala Pirinci", white rice produced from the Asian rice (Oryza sativa) grown in the ■psala
 Plain in Türkiye (C/2025/4075)

Applications for registration as PGI

- "Antep Lahmacunu/Gaziantep Lahmacunu", a thinly rolled flatbread spread with minced lamb meat and vegetables that is prepared in Gaziantep province, Türkiye (C/2025/3607)
- "Hatay Kaytaz Böreli", a pastry filled with a mixture of minced meat, vegetables, spices, and seasonings from Hatay province and its districts, Türkiye (C/2025/3672)
- "Bursa Kestane ■ekeri", candied chestnut produced in Bursa province, Türkiye (C/2025/3669)
- "Mara■ Çöre■i", nigella biscuit produced in Kahramanmara■ province, Türkiye (C/2025/4515).

Applications for Appellations of Origin and Geographical Indications

An application for the following product to be granted protection in the EU has been submitted to the Lisbon System of the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO):





• "Vaj Ulliri Valmi Elbasan", olive oil from the Elbasan area, Albania (C/2025/1846).

The following application for registration as PGI has been rejected as the European Commission considers that it did not fulfil the requirements (Regulation 2025/26):

• "Erzurum Su Böre**■**i", a pastry from Türkiye for which an application was submitted in 2021 (Commission Implementing Decision 2025/1507).

PGIs under discussion in the context of trade negotiations

Bilateral trade negotiations between the EU and non-EU countries include geographical indications for which the trade partners seek protection in the EU. The proposed PGIs are made public and can be opposed by stakeholders in the EU or other non-EU countries.

In 2025, requests for geographical indications have been published in relation to the following AGRINFO partner countries: **Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Guyana, Jamaica, Philippines, Saint Lucia, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago**. The list of products under consideration is listed in Table 1.

Actions

Objections to a name being registered as a geographical indication in the EU register (<u>eAmbrosia</u>) or in the international register (<u>Lisbon</u>) can be communicated to the European Commission within 3 and 4 months, respectively, from the date when the application is published in the *Official Journal of the European Union*.

Opposition to geographical indications proposed in the context of trade negotiations must be sent within 2 months to AGRI-G3@ec.europa.eu.

Timeline

Opposition to registration of the following applications may be lodged with the European Commission within **3 calendar months** from the date indicated.

PDO applications

- "■psala Pirinci" from Türkiye, from 17 July 2025

PGI applications

"Antep Lahmacunu/Gaziantep Lahmacunu" from Türkiye, from 2 July 2025





- "Hatay Kaytaz Böreli" from Türkiye, from 7 July 2025
- "Bursa Kestane ■ekeri" from Türkiye, from 17 July 2025
- "Mara

 i" from Türkiye, from 11 August 2025.

Opposition to geographical indications proposed in the context of trade negotiations may be lodged with the European Commission within **2 calendar months** from the publication date indicated in Table 1.
