Cabo Verde: revised 2025 fish quotas

Regulation 2025/1243 amending Annexes I and II of Regulation (2024/1288 as regards the reallocation of unused quotas for prepared or preserved fillets of tuna and tuna loins (raw, cooked and frozen), prepared or preserved mackerel fillets and prepared or preserved frigate tuna or frigate mackerel fillets

What is changing and why?

Under the European Union (EU) generalised scheme of tariff preferences (GSP+), Cabo Verde has quotas for several fish species. Seven hundred tonnes of the tuna fillets and loins quota was unused in 2024. The EU has agreed to reallocate this unused 2024 quota to 2025, increasing the quotas for prepared or preserved fillets of mackerel by 300 tonnes, and of frigate tuna by 400 tonnes.

Timeline

The revised quantities apply only to the quota period 1 January to 31 December 2025.
