

Continued suspension of certain Indonesian preferential import tariffs

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) [2025/1909](#) laying down rules for the application of Regulation (EU) No 978/2012 [...] as regards the suspension for the years 2026-2028 of certain tariff preferences granted to certain GSP beneficiary countries

What is changing and why?

Under the generalised scheme of preferences (GSP), the European Union (EU) sets lower tariffs for certain countries, allowing them to pay reduced or no tariffs on exports to the EU. These preferential tariffs can be suspended if imports from a country increase above specific thresholds (set out in Annex VI of Regulation [978/2012](#)).

On the basis of trade statistics, in relation to agri-food sectors the EU is continuing the suspension of import tariffs from Indonesia for:

- live animals and animal products, excluding fish (Section 1a)
- animal or vegetable oils, fats, and waxes (Section 3).

Timeline

Suspension of preferential import tariffs for the specific products from Indonesia will continue from 1 January 2026 to 31 December 2028.
