<u>Draft</u> Commission Implementing Regulation as regards the reference method and the authorisation of lumiVAST Trichinella as an equivalent method for detection of *Trichinella* in meat of domestic swine [pdf to be downloaded]

What is changing and why?

The European Commission is asking for feedback on proposed rules for testing pork for *Trichinella* (a parasite). The changes include:

- Reference method: Clearer rules about what and how much meat to test for Trichinella in the case of whole carcasses and cuts of pork.
- New detection method approved: The "lumiVAST Trichinella" method is authorised as an alternative equivalent detection method.

Actions

Interested stakeholders can submit comments on the <u>Have your say</u> platform until **2 January 2025** (midnight).

Timeline

The Regulation is expected to be published early 2025 and will apply 20 days after its publication.
