



## EU withdraws approval of acibenzolar-S-methyl

Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) <u>2024/1696</u> withdrawing the approval of the active substance acibenzolar-S-methyl

## What is changing and why?

The EU has withdrawn its approval of the pesticide acibenzolar-S-methyl. An applicant (manufacturer) was asked to supply additional data, but has discontinued further studies and self-classified the substance as toxic for reproduction.

## **Actions**

The maximum residue levels (MRLs) for acibenzolar-S-methyl are likely to be reduced to the limit of determination (LOD, the lowest level that can be detected using the most modern and reliable analytical methods). Suppliers of agri-food products currently using acibenzolar-S-methyl on crops for export to the EU should review their current good agricultural practices (GAP) and start to look for alternative solutions.

## **Timeline**

This Regulation applies from **20 July 2024**. EU producers will be permitted to use stocks of products containing acibenzolar-S-methyl until 10 July 2025.

A revision of acibenzolar-S-methyl MRLs is expected in 2026. Any changes to MRLs will be notified to the World Trade Organization Sanitary and Phytosanitary (WTO SPS) Committee, and details will be provided on the AGRINFO website.
