What is changing and why?

The European Commission and São Tomé and Príncipe have agreed a new [Implementing Protocol](#) (2025–2029) to the current Fisheries Partnership Agreement between the European Union (EU) and São Tomé and Príncipe, with fishing opportunities for highly migratory species (including tuna, swordfish, and oceanic whitetip shark) in São Tomé and Príncipe's waters for 35 EU vessels.

The new Protocol will allow fishing opportunities for 26 tuna seiners and 9 surface longliners from the EU fleet. The EU will provide São Tomé and Príncipe a yearly financial contribution of €825,000 for access to the country's fishing waters and to support its sectoral fisheries policy.

Timeline

The Regulation applies from **6 October 2025**.
