Commission Implementing Regulation [2025/89](#) authorising the placing on the market of UV-treated powder of whole *Tenebrio molitor* larvae (yellow mealworm) as a novel food

Commission Implementing Regulation [2025/97](#) as regards the conditions of use and the specifications of the novel food isomalto-oligosaccharide

Commission Implementing Regulation [2025/153](#) authorising the placing on the market of *Lemna minor* and *Lemna gibba* plants as novel food

What is changing and why?

The European Union (EU) has authorised UV-treated powder obtained from whole *Tenebrio molitor* larvae, and *Lemna minor* and *Lemna gibba* plants, to be placed in the market. They will be added to the [Union list of novel foods](#).

The EU has also extended the permitted uses of isomalto-oligosaccharide (IMO) to include other food categories. Detailed conditions of use for these novel foods are given in the Annexes to the respective Regulations.

The European Food Safety Authority has evaluated and confirmed the safety of these novel foods under the specified conditions.

Timeline

These novel foods may be placed on the market from the following dates:

- UV-treated powder obtained from whole *Tenebrio molitor* larvae: 10 February 2025
- *Lemna minor* and *Lemna gibba* plants: 19 February 2025
- IMO for all newly authorised uses: 19 February 2025.
