

# Maximum residue level for recombinant equine chorionic gonadotropin (reCG)

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Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) [2026/1806](#) as regards the classification of the substance recombinant equine chorionic gonadotropin with respect to its maximum residue limit in foodstuffs of animal origin

## What is changing and why?

The EU has decided that a maximum residue limit (MRL) does not need to be set for recombinant equine chorionic gonadotropin (reCG), a substance mainly used in veterinary medicines for the treatment of horses. This decision applies to all food-producing species.

## Timeline

The Regulation applies from **13 August 2026**.
