

Maximum residue levels for dodine

What is changing and why?

The European Union (EU) is proposing to increase the maximum residue level (MRL) for dodine on grapes from 0.01 to 2 mg/kg. An application for a change of MRL by the producer of dodine was evaluated by the European Food Safety Authority, and the requested changes were found to be safe for consumers.

Timeline

The Regulation is expected to be published in October 2026, and will apply 6 months after publication.
