What is changing and why?

The European Union (EU) is discussing an increase in the maximum residue level (MRL) for dodine on grapes from 0.01 to 2 mg/kg. An application for a change of MRL by the producer of dodine was evaluated by the European Food Safety Authority, and the requested changes were found to be safe for consumers.

Timeline

The new MRL is expected to apply in the second half of 2026.
