

# Maximum residue levels for pyrimethanil

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## EU raises MRLs for pyrimethanil on table grapes, garlic, and honey

Commission Regulation (EU) [2024/1078](#) of 15 April 2024 amending Annexes II and IV to Regulation (EC) No 396/2005 of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards maximum residue levels for azoxystrobin, flonicamid, isofetamid, mefentrifluconazole, metazachlor, pyrimethanil and quartz sand in or on certain products

### Update

The EU has raised the maximum residue levels (MRLs) for pyrimethanil on table grapes, garlic, and honey

### Impacted products

Table grapes, garlic, honey

### What is changing?

The EU has raised the following MRLs for pyrimethanil:

- table grapes: from 5 to 6 mg/kg
- garlic: from 0.01 to 0.03 mg/kg
- honey: from 0.05 to 0.3 mg/kg.

### Why?

Following an application to modify the MRLs for these products, [EFSA \(2023\)](#) concluded that the proposal to raise these MRLs is unlikely to be a risk to consumer safety.

### Timeline

The new MRLs apply from **6 May 2024**.
