EU increases MRL for sedaxane on potatoes

Commission Regulation (EU) <u>2023/129</u> of 18 January 2023 amending Annex II to Regulation (EC) No 396/2005 of the European Parliament and of the Council as regards maximum residue levels for azoxystrobin, prosulfocarb, sedaxane and valifenalate in or on certain products

# **Update**

The EU has published a Regulation increasing the maximum residue level (MRL) for sedaxane on potatoes.

### Impacted products

# What is changing?

The EU has increased the MRL for sedaxane on potatoes from 0.02 to 0.15 mg/kg.

## Why?

In response to an application requesting modification of the existing MRL for sedaxane on potatoes, <u>EFSA (2022</u>) concluded that the requested modification was acceptable with regard to consumer safety.

#### **Timeline**

The new MRL will apply from 26 February 2023.
