## What is changing and why?

The maximum residue levels (MRLs) that apply to radish leaves today are those set for kale. The European Commission proposes to introduce the following distinction:

Large radish leaves: MRLs for kale apply.

Small radish leaves: MRLs for Roman rocket/rucola apply.

#### **Actions**

The MRLs for kales and Roman rocket/rucola are not always the same. Exporters of **small** radish leaves should check if their products are in compliance with the MRLs for Roman rocket/rucola. An overview of all EU MRLs can be found on the the <u>EU Pesticide Residues</u> database.

#### **Timeline**

The new MRLs are expected to apply from approximately the fourth quarter of 2024.
