Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2023/943

What is changing and why?

The EU has authorised cellobiose as a novel food that may be placed on the EU market in a number of foods. These include food supplements, but not those to be used by infants and young children.

Actions

Only the company that applied for the authorisation, SAVANNA Ingredients GmbH, is authorised to place this novel food on the EU market for a period of 5 years, unless another company obtains a novel food authorisation for cellobiose, or with the agreement of SAVANNA Ingredients GmbH.

Timeline

These products are permitted on the EU maket from 1 June 2023.
