

Organic products: Recognition of control bodies

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EU approves six additional organic control authorities/bodies

Fourth amendment: Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) [2024/3121](#)

Third, second, and first amendments: Commission Implementing Regulations (EU) [2024/2794](#) of 31 October 2024 [and] [2024/2140](#) of 6 August 2024 [and] [2024/1748](#) of 21 June 2024 amending Commission Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/1378 as regards the recognition of certain control bodies in accordance with Article 46 of Regulation (EU) 2018/848 of the European Parliament and of the Council as competent to carry out controls and issue organic certificates in third countries for the purpose of imports of organic products into the Union

Update

Under the new EU organic regime, from 1 January 2025 control authorities and control bodies must be listed under Implementing Regulation (EU) 2021/1378 as being officially approved (recognised) to conduct controls and certification of organic products in non-EU countries.

The EU has published a fourth list of approved control authorities/control bodies under Regulation [2024/3121](#). This follows the publication of three earlier lists: in August 2024 (Regulation [2024/2140](#)); June 2024 (Regulation [2024/1748](#)); and October 2024 ([2024/2794](#)).

In total, 50 control authorities/control bodies have been listed.

Organic products

What is changing?

The new EU Organic Regulation (EU) [2018/848](#) brought in a fundamental change from an equivalence regime to a compliance regime, with a 3-year transition period after it was applied on 1 January 2022 (see [New EU Organic Regulation explained](#)).

Prior to 31 December 2024, the EU imported organic products certified by control authorities and control bodies whose standards were recognised as equivalent (under the old equivalence regime). From 1 January 2025, control authorities and control bodies must be officially approved

(recognised) to certify operators and groups of operators in non-EU countries under the new compliance regime.

The recognised bodies are listed under Implementing Regulation (EU) [2021/1378](#). Amendments to this Regulation will be introduced over the coming months with additional lists of the control authorities and control bodies that have been recognised.

The Regulation also amends the categories of products and specific non-EU countries that the listed control body Ecocert SAS may control.

Fourth amendment

Details on the category of products that each control authority or control body may control, and the non-EU countries in which they may carry out controls, are given in the Annexes of the draft Regulations.

Why?

From 1 January 2025, only control authorities and control bodies that are officially recognised to conduct compliance audits will be able to issue organic certificates in non-EU countries.

To be recognised by the EU, control authorities and control bodies must submit a request for recognition under Art. 46 of Regulation [2018/848](#), and must meet the required conditions.

Timeline

Control authorities and control bodies approved under these Regulations will be recognised from the following dates:

- Regulation 2024/1748 (first amendment): from 27 June 2024
- Regulation 2024/2140 (second amendment): from 10 August 2024
- Regulation 2024/2794 (third amendment): from 7 November 2024.
- Regulation 2024/3121 (fourth amendment): from 20 December 2024

What are the major implications for exporting countries?

Control authorities and control bodies must be recognised under the compliance regime from 1 January 2025. Commercial contracts between operators and control bodies are generally conducted some months in advance, and both parties will need enough time to plan and prepare for audits in 2025. It will be particularly important for operators in non-EU countries to know well in advance if their current control body will not be recognised under the new regime.

Recommended Actions

It is critically important for organic operators in non-EU countries to monitor the recognition process, and to liaise closely with their control authorities and control bodies.

Background

The Organic Regulation (EU) [2018/848](#) is the basic act that lays down the EU rules on organic production and labelling of organic products. It revises and strengthens the controls system, trade regime, and production rules that had been in place since 2007. It brought in a fundamental change to the regulatory approach, moving from the principle of equivalence to the principle of compliance. The earlier Regulation (EC) [834/2007](#) recognised that organic goods could be produced in ways that were different, but equivalent in terms of their outcome and alignment with organic principles. Under the new Organic Regulation, this changes to a system of compliance: producers in non-EU countries that do not have equivalence recognised in a trade agreement with the EU or are not recognised as an equivalent country under Regulation 834/2007 will have to conform with exactly the same set of rules as those in the EU.
