EU refuses health claim for citicoline in support of memory function

Commission Regulation [2025/2223](#) of 4 November 2025 refusing to authorise a health claim made on foods, other than those referring to the reduction of disease risk and to children's development and health

Update

The European Union (EU) has refused the health claim submitted by Edge Pharma Sp. z o.o. that the consumption of citicoline (CDP-Choline) inner salt supports memory function in healthy middle-aged and elderly people.

Impacted products

Health foods

What is changing?

The EU has confirmed its rejection of an application submitted by Edge Pharma Sp. z o.o. for a health claim that citicoline (CDP-Choline) intake supports memory function in healthy middle-aged and elderly people with age-related memory impairment.

Why?

The European Food Safety Authority ([EFSA 2024](#)) concluded that, based on the data presented, a cause-and-effect relationship cannot be established between consumption of citicoline (CDP-Choline) inner salt and its effect on age-associated subjective memory impairment in healthy middle-aged or elderly adults.

This health claim is not included in the Union list of permitted health claims because it does not comply with the requirements of Regulation [1924/2006](#).

Timeline

This Regulation applies from **25 November 2025**.

Background

Regulation EC [1924/2006](#) prohibits health claims made on foods unless they are authorised by the European Commission and included in the Union list of permitted health claims (Regulation No [432/2012](#)), supported by a favourable EFSA opinion.
