Commission Delegated Regulation (EU) <u>2024/2684</u> as regards the protein-related requirements for infant and follow-on formula manufactured from protein hydrolysates

What is changing and why?

The European Union (EU) proposes to amend the compositional requirements for the content, source, processing, and quality of protein for infant and follow-on formula manufactured from protein hydrolysates, following an evaluation by the European Food Safety Authority.

In 2024, the European Commission approved a specific protein hydrolysate derived from whey protein for use in infant formula and follow-on formula.

Actions

The EU has notified this proposal to the World Trade Organization Technical Barriers to Trade (WTO TBT) Committee. Where a country is a member of the WTO, comments on the proposal can be submitted via the <u>National TBT notification authority</u> of the country concerned to the <u>EU TBT Enquiry Point</u> until **14 September 2025**.

Timeline

The new Regulation is expected to be adopted in approximately the first quarter of 2026.
