

Reports on non-compliance with EU food law and agri-food fraud: July 2026

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Latest EU overview of food found not to comply with EU law

European Commission: [July 2026 Report on EU Agri-Food Fraud Suspicions](#)

Update

The European Commission publishes monthly overviews of foods that are not compliant with European Union (EU) food law. The July 2026 report includes notifications concerning the following 24 AGRINFO [partner countries](#): Argentina, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, China, Colombia, Côte d'Ivoire, Ecuador, Ghana, Guatemala, India, Indonesia, Iran, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Lebanon, Malaysia, Moldavia, Peru, Philippines, Thailand, Türkiye, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Viet Nam.

These monthly overviews highlight ongoing and emerging risks of non-compliance that help agri-food exporters and competent authorities in non-EU countries to identify, monitor, and address risks that may affect trade. These non-compliances are not confirmed fraud cases, but they contribute to alerting and triggering investigations by competent authorities of EU Member States.

Impacted products

Apricots, apple-pomegranate, bakery products, banana leaf extract, bananas, buckwheat, cake mix, cardamom (organic), catfish (Arius proops), chocolate, duck eggs, food supplements, frog legs, ginger, honey, miso paste, muscimol powder, noodles, olive oil, palm cream, palm oil, passion fruit pulp, dragon fruit pulp, prekese (Tetrapleura tetraptera), rice flour, S-adenosyl-L-methionine disulfate tosylate, sauces (adobo and chilli), sheep casings, shrimps (Litopenaeus vannamei), soyabean hull pellets, spice mix, sweets, tea, green tea, tilapia (Oreochromis niloticus)

Latest notifications

The July 2026 report includes notifications involving the following 24 AGRINFO [partner countries](#): Argentina, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, China, Colombia, Côte d'Ivoire, Ecuador, Ghana, Guatemala, India, Indonesia, Iran, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Lebanon, Malaysia, Moldavia, Peru, Philippines, Thailand, Türkiye, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Viet Nam.

These notifications concern:

- product and record tampering (Table 1)
- unauthorised foods, ingredients and origins, and residues not compliant with maximum residue levels (MRLs) (Table 2).

This report should be read in conjunction with [RASFF notifications in July 2026](#). RASFF notifications that relate purely to consumer risk with no suspicion of fraud are not included in this report.

Timeline

These reports are issued every month.

Recommended Actions

Competent authorities in countries that are included in these monthly overviews should pay attention to any non-compliances identified in the reports. It is particularly important that the producers/export companies concerned are informed as soon as possible so that they can take action and prevent a recurrence. These incidents also potentially indicate a more widespread problem that may require a coordinated response by the food sector in the country concerned.

Background

These monthly reports compile information notified to the EU's Rapid Alert System for Food and Feed Network ([RASFF](#)), Administrative Assistance and Cooperation Network ([AAC](#)), and Agri-Food Fraud Network ([FFN](#)). The reports also include non-compliances with EU rules that do not present a risk but have triggered investigations by the competent authorities of individual importing EU Member States.
