European Commission: June 2024 Report on EU Agri-Food Fraud suspicions

#### What is changing and why?

The European Commission publishes monthly overviews of foods that are not compliant with EU food law, including potentially fraudulent practices identified and reported by EU Member State authorities, based on Rapid Alert System for Food and Feed Network (RASSF) notifications among other sources. These reports help stakeholders in the agri-food sector to identify risks and adapt monitoring strategies.

The June 2024 report on EU agri-food fraud suspicions includes notifications impacting Afghanistan, Argentina, Bangladesh, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Brazil, China, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Egypt, Ghana, India, Iran, Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Lebanon, Malaysia, Mexico, Morocco, Namibia, Pakistan, Peru, Philippines, Rwanda, Serbia, South Africa, Sri Lanka, Tanzania, Thailand, Türkiye, Uganda, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, and Vietnam.

#### **Actions**

Competent authorities in countries that are included in these monthly overviews should pay attention to any non-compliances identified in the reports. It is particularly important that the producers/export companies concerned are informed as soon as possible so that they can take action and prevent a recurrence. These incidents also potentially indicate a more widespread problem that may require a coordinated response by the food sector in the country concerned.

#### **Timeline**

A report is issued every month.
