

Review of autonomous tariff suspensions and quotas scheme for agricultural goods

What is changing and why?

The European Commission has launched a call for evidence inviting stakeholders to provide information and views on the impact of the autonomous tariff suspensions and quotas (ATSQ) scheme. This scheme reduces or suspends import tariffs on a set quantity of products (quota) for certain strategic raw materials that are not produced, or insufficiently produced, in the European Union (EU).

The evaluation aims to determine whether the scheme still effectively meets the needs of EU manufacturers and is administratively efficient.

Actions

All interested stakeholders are invited to give feedback via the European Commission's [Have Your Say](#) platform until **8 October 2026**. Stakeholders wishing to respond must be registered. Those who are not will first need to [create an EU login account](#), then register their organisation on the EU [Transparency register](#).

Timeline

The European Commission plans to formally adopt the outcome of the evaluation in the first quarter of 2027.
