## S-metolachlor: Non renewal of EU approval

Regulation (EU) <u>2024/20</u> concerning the non-renewal of the approval of the active substance S-metolachlor

## What is changing and why?

Due to concerns about the health of animals and water contamination, the EU has decided not to renew its approval for the use of S-metolachlor in EU Member States.

## **Actions**

EU maximum residue limits (MRLs) for S-metolachlor are currently already set at low levels (0.01–0.05 mg/kg). Suppliers exporting to the EU may continue to use S-metolachlor provided residues do not exceed existing MRLs (0.01–0.05 mg/kg).

## **Timeline**

EU producers may be permitted to use stocks of products containing S-metolachlor until 23 July 2024.
