# Tariff quotas: shrimps and food preparations

Regulation (EU) <u>2023/2908</u> as regards the volumes of food preparations, processed shrimp of the species *Pandalus borealis* and certain plywood of coniferous species that may be imported under tariff quotas 09.0013, 09.0047, 09.0088 and 09.0096

## What is changing and why?

The following quotas permitting specified imports to enter the EU at lower import duties (tariffs) have been increased:

- shrimps and prawns of the species Pandalus borealis, shelled, boiled, and frozen but not otherwise prepared: increase in quota volume from 474 to 500 tonnes at 0% duty (CN codes 1605 21 10, 1605 21 90, 1605 29 00)
- other food preparations not elsewhere specified or included: increase in quota volume from 702 to 783 tonnes at 18% duty (CN code 2106 90 98).

### **Actions**

A list of all available quotas can be found in the Annex to Regulation <u>32/2000</u> (click on "Current consolidated version"). It is possible to track how much of an individual quota has been used via the Commission webpage <u>Tariff quota consultation</u>. In this case, enter the order numbers:

- shrimps and prawns: 090047
- other food preparations: 090088.

### **Timeline**

The new quotas came into force on 22 December 2023.
