What is changing and why?

To import chicken and turkey from Brazil under certain tariff rate quotas, operators must currently provide a certificate of origin as proof that products originate in Brazil. To reduce delays caused by this requirement, the European Commission proposes to simplify the rules: when applying for a licence, operators will have to present a supply contract showing the availability of poultry supplies during the quota period.

Actions

Timeline

This proposal is expected to be adopted and published in the fourth quarter of 2025.

The new rules will apply to the first licence application period that opens following a 90-day period after the Regulation is published. Import licences issued before the new rules apply must be accompanied by a certificate of origin.
