

Transport packaging: reuse of pallet wrappings and straps

What is changing and why?

According to the Packaging and Packaging Waste Regulation (PPWR), from 1 January 2030, transport packaging, including pallet wrappings and straps used to stabilise and protect products placed on pallets during transport, must be fully reusable.

However, a complete transition to reusable types of packaging would require technologies that are not yet developed, as well as significant financial investment. To avoid disrupting supply chains and increasing costs, the European Commission proposes to exempt pallet wrappings and straps from this requirement.

The Commission is now collecting feedback from operators on this proposal via its [Have Your Say](#) webpage.

Actions

Timeline

This Regulation is scheduled for adoption in the fourth quarter of 2025/ first quarter of 2026.
