

# Tritosulfuron: non-renewal of approval

## Regulation

[Draft](#) Commission Implementing Regulation concerning the non-renewal of approval of the active substance tritosulfuron

## What is changing and why?

The European Commission proposes not to renew its approval for the pesticide tritosulfuron. This is because the manufacturer has withdrawn its application for renewal of the approval.

This decision should have no impact on exports to the EU as the EU maximum residue levels (MRLs) for tritosulfuron are already set at the limit of determination (LOD – the lowest level that can be detected using the most modern and reliable analytical methods). Suppliers exporting to the EU may only continue to use tritosulfuron provided residues do not exceed these existing MRLs (0.01–0.05 mg/kg).

## Actions

Authorities in countries that are members of the World Trade Organization (WTO) can provide feedback on the EU's proposal ([G/TBT/N/EU/1078](#)) by emailing the [EU TBT Enquiry Point](#) until **28 September 2024**.

## Timeline

Expected date of entry into force: fourth quarter of 2024.

Existing EU Member State authorisations of products containing tritosulfuron will have to be withdrawn within 6 months after the Regulation enters into force.

EU producers will be permitted to use stocks of products containing this substance for up to 12 months after the Regulation enters into force (approximately to the end of 2025).
