Regulation (EU) [2024/2166](#) on the introduction and management of tariff-rate quotas for honey

What is changing and why?

In response to Russia's aggression against Ukraine, the EU had temporarily removed tariffs and quotas for all goods. However, due to relatively high imports of honey in 2025, the EU has reintroduced the tariff rate quota for honey.

As a result, for the rest of 2024 the full most favoured nations (MFN) import tariff will apply on imports of honey from Ukraine. From 1 January to 5 June 2025, a new tariff rate quota for honey from Ukraine of 18,507.32 tonnes at zero duty will apply.

Timeline

The MFN tariff applies to honey from Ukraine from **21 August 2024**.
