



Welcome to Issue 43 of AGRINFO UPDATE. There are opportunities to provide feedback to the European Union on a proposal to prolong temporary measures for citrus black spot, and to the World Trade Organization on the non-renewal of flufenacet. New Regulations coming into force cover changes to pesticide maximum residue levels (MRLs), feed additives, the EU register of protected geographical indications (PGI), the list of countries that can export animal products to the EU, and the EU–Mauritania Fisheries Partnership Agreement. We also provide information on the upcoming 2025 programme of EU audits and remote assessments in AGRINFO partner countries.

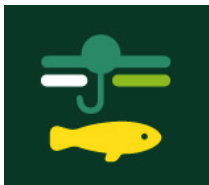


### Pesticide MRLs
