Of particular note in this issue: the European Commission has published a *Frequently Asked Questions* document clarifying its recently published Deforestation Regulation. There is an important opportunity for non-EU countries to provide feedback on a proposal to stop the export of pesticides that are not authorised in the EU, and to comment on a proposal to reduce the MRLs for eight active substances including prochloraz, a fungicide widely used on avocados, papayas, cereals and oilseeds. And the EU has authorised imports of new varieties of genetically modified (GM) maize.

Pesticide MRLs

Changes are proposed to the maximum residue levels for:

- prochloraz (fruit, cultivated fungi, oilseeds, rye, wheat and animal products)
- (Z)-13-hexadecen-11-yn-1-yl acetate (all products)
- (Z,Z,Z,Z)-7,13,16,19-docosatetraen-1-yl isoburyrate (all products)
- <u>acrinathrin</u> (fruits, fungi, oilseeds, sugar plants and vegetables)
- azimsulfuron (animal products milk, muscle)
- <u>famoxadone</u> (teas, infusions, fungi, oilseeds, cereals and animal products)
- methyl nonyl ketone (all products)
- sodium hypochlorite (all products)
