Changes have been proposed to clarify and simplify the EU Deforestation Regulation; there is an opportunity for stakeholders, including those in non-EU countries, to provide feedback. Updates have also been made to various EU resources that explain how to comply with the EUDR – our AGRINFO report <u>EU</u> <u>Deforestation Regulation: publications and resources</u> gives all the links.

#### Food supplements/dietetic foods

EU proposes to list magnesium L-threonate as a source of magnesium allowed in food supplements. Feedback to WTO by **6 June**

#### New Regulations coming into force and application dates



#### **Animal health certification**

EU updates animal health certificates for certain live terrestrial animals. Applies from **12 May 2025**

#### Food additives

EU restricts use of cellulose gum in dietary foods for infants and reduces maximum limits for toxic elements in 11 cellulose additives. Applies from **27 October 2025** and **27 April 2027**

## **Novel/traditional foods**

- EU approves changes to specifications of <u>partially defatted</u> <u>rapeseed powder</u> from *Brassica rapa* and *Brassica napus*. Applies from 29 April 2025
- EU authorises use of novel food <u>Schizochytrium oil</u> in certain protein products. Applies from 30 April 2025



#### **Pesticide MRLs**

EU increases MRLs for:

- <u>dichlorprop-P</u> on barley, oats, rye, and wheat
- phosphonic acid on barley, oats, rye, and wheat
- cycloxydim on pome fruits, peas, maize, and sugar beet roots

and amends MRLs for:

• <u>flupyradifurone</u> on various products

Applies from 17 April 2025
