Mineral oil hydrocarbons (MOH) from petroleum find their way into the food supply chain from the environment, or during harvest, transport, or processing. These can create health risks for consumers. As a result, in 2027 the EU will introduce new rules to limit the presence of MOH in food. Pesticide MRLs

EU discusses reduction of MRLs to 0.01 mg/kg for:

- carbendazim on oranges, grapefruit, mangoes, and papayas
- <u>thiophanate-methyl</u> on oranges, grapefruit, mandarins, mangoes, and papayas



New Regulations coming into force and application dates



Food safety

- EU sets MRLs for <u>ketoprofen</u> in animal products (ruminants, pigs, horses) – applies from 24 June 2025
- EU adds five <u>"chemical-unlike" biological substances</u> to list of authorised pharmacologically active substances in food-producing animals – applies from 24 June 2025

EU authorises flavourings Naringenin and 2-methyl-1-(2-(5-(p-tolyl)-1H-imidazol-2-yl)piperidin-1-yl)butan-1 — applies from **25 June 2025**
