Welcome to Issue 53 of AGRINFO UPDATE. This issue highlights upcoming changes on animal welfare, a review of synergists and safeners in pesticides, and public consultation on the EU–Mauritania Fisheries Partnership Agreement. New Regulations coming into force include the authorisation of sodium ascorbate (E 301) in infant formula, and MRL changes for ethephon and chlorpropham, among others.

This issue also includes the latest reports from the EU on food safety and plant health non-compliances, with significant numbers of AGRINFO partner countries receiving notifications. Non-compliances can lead to the application of increased controls by EU authorities, and we summarise the latest official changes, expected to apply from August. AGRINFO recently completed a study to understand the effect that increased controls have on exporting countries, and the long-term impacts on trade. The findings have been used to develop a new <u>Guidance document</u>.

AGRINFO has also recently published a Guide on exporting aquaculture products to the EU.

Finally, in response to increased interest and requests for information on expected changes to rules concerning mineral oil hydrocarbons (MOH), AGRINFO has updated its <u>Guidance on MOH</u>, and recordings of our recent <u>MOH webinar series</u> are now available.

Foot and mouth disease: EU removes Eswatini from list of countries that meet EU animal health requirements. Applies from **14 June 2025**



Tariffs & quotas

EU increases 2025 quotas for fish from Cabo Verde. Applies from 1 January to 31 December 2025



Food additives

EU authorises use of sodium ascorbate (E 301) in vitamin A preparations for infant formula. Applies from **2 July 2025**
