The European Union has announced a review of its fisheries policy, and is collecting feedback from all stakeholders. There are also open consultations on the EU's approach to defining high-risk organic products, and on amended specifications for infant formula. The EU has published Regulations increasing official controls on specific foods considered to be high risk; raising acetamiprid maximum residue levels (MRLs) on certain products; and making changes to the CATCH system for EU fish imports.
