EU proposes to:

- lower cyproconazole MRLs to 0.01 on certain fruits, pulses, oilseeds, and cereals
- amend <u>spirodiclofen</u> MRLs with impacts on berries and bananas

Pesticide MRLs

EU approves import tolerance MRLs from **12 February 2024** for:

- fipronil on sugarcane and animal products
- mandipropamid on papayas

EU lowers MRLs from 12 August 2024 for:

- <u>flutriafol</u> on beetroots, mustard/gold of pleasure seeds, rice, rye, and sugar beet roots
- <u>diethofencarb</u> on pears, wine grapes, tomatoes, and aubergines
- <u>fenoxycarb</u> to the limit of determination on all products

EU lowers MRLs from 14 August 2024 for:

• indoxacarb on all products

EU decides no MRLs needed for *Trichoderma atroviride* and *Pythium oligandrum* strains – applies from **6 February 2024**
