Welcome to Issue 67 of AGRINFO UPDATE. As previously reported, the European Union is simplifying various rules, including a proposed new approach to setting pesticide maximum residue levels for imported products. The EU has now notified these proposals to the World Trade Organization, giving the opportunity for feedback by non-EU countries.

The EU has updated the list of animal products that certain non-EU countries can export, adopted new pesticide MRLs, and revised the specifications for certain food additives.

Simplification of EU rules

Stakeholder feedback to WTO is due by **30 March** on proposals to simplify rules on:

- [pesticides](#) – setting MRLs on imported products and approving new substances
- foods produced using [genetically modified micro-organisms](#)
- allowing [border control posts](#) to split consignments of plant products
- authorisation of [feed additives](#) and digital labelling
- regulatory changes on [transmissible spongiform encephalopathy](#) (TSE, “mad cow disease”)

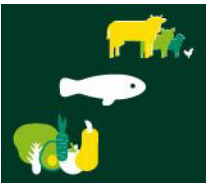
New Regulations coming into force and application dates

EU amends conditions of use for various thickening agents and stabilisers. Applies from **18 August 2026**

Pesticide MRLs

EU amends maximum residue levels for:

- [dimoxystrobin](#) on sunflower seeds, rye, and wheat
- [ethephon](#) on blueberries and tree nuts
- [propamocarb](#) on lettuces
