



Welcome to Issue 22 of AGRINFO UPDATE. Recently adopted regulations include changes in the frequency of import controls on certain food plants. There are opportunities to provide feedback to the World Trade Organization on proposals to withdraw feed additives, and on changes to mustard seed allergen labelling. You can also send feedback to the EU on a proposal to amend pesticide MRLs related to radish leaves. AGRINFO UPDATE explains how to send feedback and highlights the deadlines. It is important for countries to give feedback on proposed changes to regulations, especially where they could impact trade.
