



Welcome to Issue 23 of AGRINFO UPDATE. Among the latest developments, the EU is proposing for the first time to set maximum permitted levels of nickel in a variety of foods. This proposal has been notified to the World Trade Organization, together with proposals on the review of certain food additives, and withdrawal of approval of the pesticide acibenzolar-S-methyl. There are also possibilities to provide feedback into two policy areas: the introduction of stricter rules on plastic food contact materials, and an evaluation of animal health rules. AGRINFO UPDATE explains how to send feedback and highlights the deadlines. It is important for countries to give feedback on proposed changes to regulations, especially where they could impact trade. The EU has also moved a step closer towards finalising its rules preventing the sale of products made with forced labour.
