This issue highlights increased official controls on some imported products, as well as increased plant health checks to reduce the risk of importing pests and diseases into the European Union (EU). The EU has updated the list of countries regarding the use of antimicrobials in farm animals and their products. The latest RASFF notifications have also been published, where potential health risks to EU consumers have been identified.

In this issue we highlight opportunities to give your feedback to the EU on reporting standards related to the Corporate Sustainability Reporting Directive, and on the forthcoming European Ocean Act.

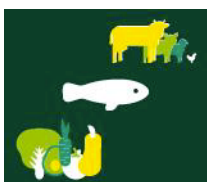
