



Welcome to Issue 76 of AGRINFO UPDATE. EU Member States have approved new maximum levels for mineral oil aromatic hydrocarbons (MOAH) for certain foods. The EU has also published an updated list of non-EU countries authorised to export animals and animal products under its new antimicrobial requirements; authorised imports of a genetically modified soyabean and a new novel food; reauthorised certain feed additives; and lifted restrictions on poultry imports from Bosnia and Herzegovina. The EU has updated its temporary increased official controls on certain foods, and published its latest report on non-compliance with EU food law.

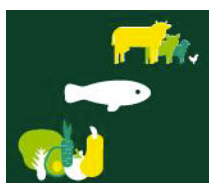

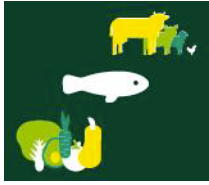

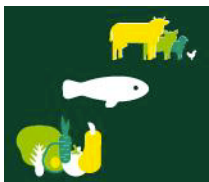
