



AGRINFO UPDATE 80 (2026)

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In AGRINFO UPDATE 80: the European Commission has set out its long-term strategy on supporting the livestock sector, and its action plan to strengthen the European Union (EU) protein supply. It has also published a study on the economic impact of recently proposed changes to rules on pesticide maximum residue levels (MRLs). New EU proposals are now open for stakeholder feedback on recycled plastic packaging, and on organic feed for piglets and young poultry. Recently published EU Regulations include updated animal health rules, changes to the lists of prohibited pests, and new maximum levels for contaminants in baby foods and herbal infusions. The EU has also updated its programme of food audits of non-EU countries.

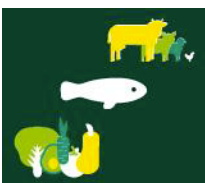

Priority pests

EU adds Mexican cabbage head caterpillar and darkling beetle to list of prohibited pests, and extends listing of three pests – applies from **30 July 2026**

Animal health

- EU [updates animal health rules](#) for non-EU countries – applies from **12 August 2026**
- EU reauthorises imports of [poultry from Argentina](#) – applies from **17 August 2026**
- EU amends list of [veterinary medicinal products essential for treatment of horses](#) – applies from **28 July 2026**



Packaging

EU extends authorisation of plastic recycling methods to include use in chemical recycling technologies, and introduces new rules to calculate recycled plastic content in single-use plastic bottles – applies from **23 July 2026**

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Organic production

Updated list of competent authorities and control bodies in non-EU countries recognised as having EU-equivalent organic production systems – applies from **26 July 2026**

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Contaminants

EU sets new maximum levels for:

- [Δ9-THC](#) in hemp leaves for infusion and ready-to-drink herbal infusions made from hemp leaves – applies from **1 January 2027**
- [3-MCPD and glycidol](#) in baby foods and compound foods – applies from **1 January 2027**
- [furan, 2-methylfuran, and 3-methylfuran](#) in processed cereal-based foods for infants/young children, and in baby food – applies from **1 January 2028**
