Where policies and regulations are still under development, there are opportunities to comment and influence the process. For example, the item below on the amended EU rules on food contact materials has been notified to the World Trade Organization (WTO). Following a notification, there is a 60-day period during which stakeholders can send any comments or concerns about potential impacts to the WTO via the <u>National</u> <u>SPS notification authority</u> of the country concerned. For this example, comments on the proposed new EU rules on food contact materials can be sent to the SPS Committee (notification <u>G/SPS/N/EU/611</u>) before **24 March 2023**.

Please note that if you are subscribed to AGRINFO as a representative of either the public sector, a sector association (business membership organisation) or a farmer organisation in one of the 143 AGRINFO target countries, you can use the Ask AGRINFO service to ask for more information about a particular policy or regulation.

New pesticide MRLs

Changes will apply from **25 February 2023** affecting:

- <u>thiamethoxam</u> (fruits, vegetables, cereals, teas, coffees, cereals, animal products)
- <u>clothianidin</u> (fruits, vegetables, cereals, teas, coffees, sugar, animal products)

Changes will apply from 16 August 2023 affecting:

- cycloxydim (fruits, vegetables, oilseeds, pulses, animal products)
- <u>cyfluthrin</u> (fruits, vegetables, cereals)
- penthiopyrad (fruits, vegetables, cereals)

Changes will apply from 20 August 2023 affecting:

<u>abamectin</u> (tree nuts, fruits, vegetables, salads)
