



In AGRINFO UPDATE 82: the European Union (EU) has now clarified which products will fall under the EU Deforestation Regulation. Also – which non-EU countries can expect food audits in 2027? There are opportunities to give feedback on proposed new rules on more detailed hygiene requirements related to fresh meat; and a review of the management of autonomous trade quotas.

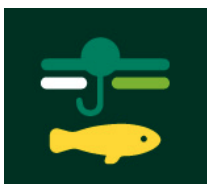
