



Welcome to Issue 31 of AGRINFO UPDATE. This highlights publication of the Corporate Sustainability Due Diligence Directive, which will be applied piecemeal from mid-2027 to mid-2029. New regulations have also come into force on priority pests and animal health certificates, among others, and there is opportunity to provide feedback to the WTO on proposed reductions in MRLs for acetamiprid.

In this issue we are pleased to announce that translations are now available in French and Spanish, and other languages will follow soon. Translation of the AGRINFO reports are unverified machine translations, but we hope that this will nevertheless be a valuable development that makes it easier to access the information you need.
