Welcome to Issue 32 of AGRINFO UPDATE. This issue lists several new Regulations that are coming into force (and their dates) following earlier public consultation. There are three new opportunities to send feedback to the World Trade Organization concerning organic production and pesticides, including proposed amendments to the maximum residue levels for dithiocarbamates (covering maneb and mancozeb, among others). AGRINFO UPDATE explains how to send feedback and highlights the deadlines.

Issue 32 also includes the June summaries of RASFF and plant health (EUROPHYT) interceptions, and reports on non-compliances with EU food law and agri-food fraud. It is important to follow up these reports – each incident potentially indicates a more widespread problem that would require a coordinated response by the authorities and operators in the countries concerned.

- 35 <u>AGRINFO partner countries</u> received <u>RASFF</u> notifications, including 167 on food products
- 98 plant health (<u>EUROPHYT</u>) interceptions due to harmful organisms involving 25 partner countries; 308 interceptions due to other non-conformities involving 35 partner countries
- Reports on non-compliance with EU food law and <u>agri-food fraud</u> involving 35 partner countries
