Public health list of countries that can export to EU. Added: Azerbaijan, Lebanon, Moldova, also Thailand for triangular trade. Delisted: Colombia, Rwanda, Syria – applies from **29 March 2023**

EU suspends imports of poultry and game bird meat and products from Argentina after HPAI outbreak – applies from **11 March 2023**

EU adds Moldova to the list of countries authorised to export poultry products and eggs to the EU – applies from **29 March 2023**

New pesticide MRLs

Changes will apply from 26 September 2023 affecting:

- isoxaben (all products)
- novaluron (fruits, vegetables, animal products)
- tetraconazole (fruits, vegetables, oilseeds, cereals, sugar plants, animal products)
