

Welcome to Issue 41 of AGRINFO Update. In this final issue of 2024, we report on recently completed technical negotiations between the EU and Mercosur on a new Partnership Agreement; proposals to clarify the methods for testing *Trichinella* in pork; and proposed changes to pesticide maximum residue levels (MRLs) notified to the World Trade Organization SPS Committee – we explain how and when to send feedback. The EU has now increased import controls on specific products from Bangladesh, India, Madagascar, Rwanda, Türkiye, and Vietnam, and has aligned its rules on winemaking methods and treatments with updated international standards. We also include the latest monthly reports on food imports that are not compliant with EU law.
